Why Choose SEQUANOTA

Summer camp promotes community. It nurtures a sacred place where kids learn to live together and care for one another. Camp is a place where kids can "practice" growing up by strengthening their social, emotional, physical, and cognitive muscles away



from their immediate family. Camp provides a laboratory for childhood explorations to happen.

When I was in elementary school I lived in a small town. What made this place so cool was having 6-8 other young boys around to play kick ball, hide and seek, and build forts outside. We formed a community. We did not always get along in our playing. Sometimes fights would break out, but we had to sort these problems out if we wanted to keep playing. We learned conflict management and communication. We grew in trust with each other. We taught each other new skills and celebrated our successes together. This neighborhood community helped me grow in self confidence and built character.

In today's world studies show our children stay inside more, are less physical, and have increased anxiety in their lives. They are losing that sense of neighborhood that many of us were blessed to experience in our safe, small hometown. At Sequanota, we recognize the value of community and strive for each camper to be welcomed into our intentional, Christian community.

Being in community at camp helps kids learn to solve problems. As we live into the future there will be plenty of challenges that will need solutions. Camp helps the next generation of problem solvers to relate, connect, and inspire. These skills are as important as math and science. It will do no one any good if our solved problems are locked away in the minds of young adults, who are anxious communicating what they know.

Another piece of the community at camp is the natural setting. Time in the forest has been proven to reduce stress by 10% simply by taking a walk and breathing in the forest air. Camp provides a place where campers can explore the natural world around, learn how their actions can make an impact - good or bad, and discover their place alongside all of creation.

I hope this summer you might give camp a try and watch how the wonder and care of the camp community can make a difference and shape the life of your loved ones. Camp does kids a world of good.


Donors
